

## Morning Prayer

### *Invitatory and Psalter* p. 80

Use the antiphons with either the **Venite** or the **Jubilate Deo** throughout the year. It is traditional to use the **Venite** in Advent and Lent, the **Jubilate Deo** in Christmas, Epiphany, and Saints' days. Use the **Pascha Nostrum** during Pascha.

### **Psalms**

Choose the psalm(s) from the lectionary. Say the *Gloria Patri* at the end of the last psalm: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

### **Lessons and Canticles**

Alternate lessons and canticles; Chose the lessons from the lectionary.
