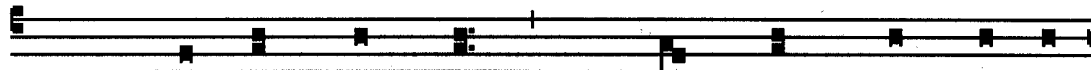
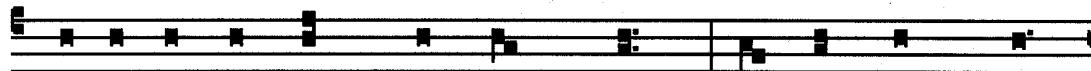

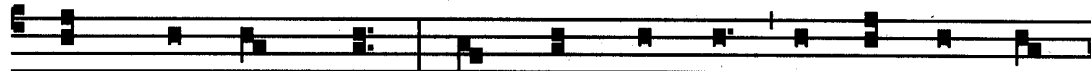

Response: For the Lord is risen indeed, Alleluia.

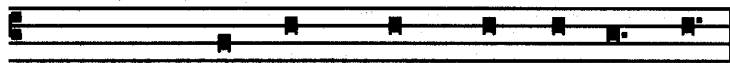

died, and was bu-*ri'd*.

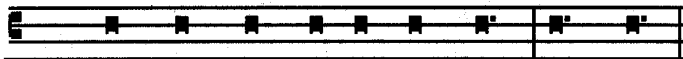
He descended to the *dead*.

hand of the Fa-*ther*.

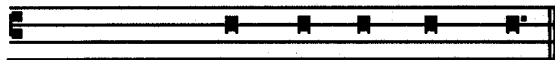
