among women, and blessèd is the fruit of your womb, Jesus.

Response: Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the

hour of our death. Amen.

Officiant: Behold the handmaid of the Lord; Response: Be it unto me according to your word.

Officiant: Hail Mary, etc.

Officiant: And the Word was made flesh.

Response: And dwelled among us.

Officiant: Hail Mary, etc.

Officiant: Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

Response: That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Response:And with our absent brothers and sisters. Amen.
