
# The Psalter or Psalms of David

# First Day MORNING PRAYER




- 1 Happy are they who have not walk'd in the counsel of the wick-ed, \* nor linger'd in the way of sinners, / nor sat in the seats of the scorn-ful!
- 2 Their delight is in the law of the Lord, \* and they meditate on his law day (and) night.
- 3 They are like trees planted by streams of water, / bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that do not with-er; \* everything they do shall pros-per.
- 4 It is not so (with) the wick-ed; \* they are like chaff which the wind blows (a)way.
- 5 Therefore the wicked shall not stand up•right when judg(ment) comes, \* nor the sinner in the council of the right-eous.
- 6 For the Lord knows the way (of) the right-eous, \* but the way of the wick-ed is doom'd.




- 1 Why are the nations in an up-roar? \* Why do the peoples mut•ter emp(ty) threats?
- 2 Why do the kings of the earth rise up in revolt, / and the princes plot to-gether, \* against the Lord and against his A-noin-ted?
- 3 "Let us break (their) yoke," they say; \* "let us cast off their bonds (from) us."
- 4 He whose throne is in hea-ven (is) laugh-ing; \* the Lord has them in de-ri-sion.
- 5 Then he speaks (to) them (in) his wrath, \* and his rage fills them with ter-ror.




- 6 "I my self (have) set my king \* upon my holy hill of Zi-on."
- 7 Let me announce the de•cree of the Lord: \* he said to me, "You are my Son; / this day have I be-got(ten) you.
- 8 Ask of me, and I will give you the nations for your (in)her-i-tance \* and the ends of the earth for your pos-ses-sion.
- 9 You shall crush them with (an) i-ron rod \* and shatter them like a piece of pot(te)ry."
  - 10 And now, (you) kings, be wise; \* be warn'd, you rul•ers of (the) earth.
  - 11 Sub mit (to) the (Lord) with fear, \* and with trembling bow be-fore him;
  - 12 Lest he be ang(ry) and (you) per-ish; \* for his wrath is quick ly kin-dl'd.
  - 13 Hap(py) are they all \* who take re•fuge in him!



- 1 Lord, how many adversaries I have! \_\_\_ \* how many there are who rise up a-gainst me!
- 2 How many there are who say (of) me, \* "There is no help for him in his God."
- 3 But you, O Lord, are a shield a bout me; \* you are my glory, / the one who lifts up my head.
  - 4 I call aloud upon the Lord, \_\_\_ \* and he answers me from his ho(ly) hill;
- 5 I lie down and go (to) sleep; \* I wake again, because the Lord sus-tains me.
- 6 I do not fear the multitudes of peo-ple \* who set themselves against me all a-round.
- 7 Rise up, O Lord; / set me free, O my God; \* surely, you will strike all my enemies across the face, / you will break the teeth of the wicked.
- 8 Deliverance belongs to the Lord. \_\_ \* Your blessing be upon your people! Glory to the Father, and to the Son, / and to the Holy Spi-rit: \* as it was in the beginning, is now, / and will be for ev•er. A-men.



1 Answer me when I call, O God, defender of my • cause; \_\_\_ \* you set me free when I am hard-press'd; / have mercy on • me and hear (my) prayer.



- 2 "You mortals, how long will you dishonor my glo-ry; \* how long will you worship dumb idols and run af-ter false gods?"
- 3 Know that the Lord does wonders for the faith-ful; \* when I call upon the Lord, he will hear me.
- 4 Tremble, then, and do (not) sin; \* speak to your heart in si•lence up-on (your) bed.
  - 5 Offer the appointed sacri•fi-ces \* and put your trust in the Lord.
- 6 Many are saying, / "Oh, that we might see bet(ter) times!" \* Lift up the light of your countenance up-on us, (O) Lord.
- 7 You have put gladness in my heart, \_\_\* more than when grain and wine and oil (in)crease.
- 8 I lie down in peace; / at once I fall (a)sleep; \* for only you, Lord, make me dwell in safe-ty.




- 1 Give ear to my words, O Lord; \* consider my med-i-ta-tion.
- 2 Hearken to my cry for help, my King and my God, \* for I make my pray'r (to) you.
- 3 In the morning, Lord, you hear my voice; \* early in the morning I make my ap•peal and watch (for) you.
- 4 For you are not a God who takes pleasure in wick•ed-ness, \* and evil can-not dwell (with) you.
- 5 Braggarts cannot stand in your sight; \* you hate all those who work wick(ed)ness.
- 6 You destroy those who speak lies; \* the bloodthirsty and deceitful, O Lord, you ab-hor.
- 7 But as for me, / through the greatness of your mercy I will go into your house; \* I will bow down toward your holy tem•ple in awe (of) you.
- 8 Lead me, O Lord, in your righteousness, / because of those who lie in wait for me; \* make your way straight be-fore me.
- 9 For there is no truth in their mouth; \* there is des•truc-tion in (their) heart;
  - 10 Their throat is an op en grave; \* they flat-ter with (their) tongue.
  - 11 Declare them guilty, O God; \* let them fall, be cause of their schemes.



- 12 Because of their many transgressions cast them out, \* for they have re•bell'd a-gainst you.
- 13 But all who take refuge in you will be glad; \* they will sing out their joy for ev-er.
- 14 You will shel ter them, \* so that those who love your Name may ex-ult (in) you.
- 15 For you, O Lord, will bless the right-eous; \* you will defend them with your fa vor as with (a) shield.

# First Day

#### **EVENING PRAYER**



- 1 Lord, do not rebuke me in your an-ger; \* do not punish me in your wrath.
- 2 Have pity upon me, Lord, for I am weak; \* heal me, Lord, for my bones (are) rack'd.
  - 3 My spirit shakes with ter-ror; \* how long, O Lord, (how) long?
  - 4 Turn, O Lord, and de li(ver) me; \* save me for your mer(cy's) sake.
- 5 For in death no one re•mem(bers) you; \* and who will give you thanks in the grave?
- 6 I grow weary because of my groan-ing; \* every night I drench my bed and flood my couch (with) tears.
- 7 My eyes are wasted with grief \_\_\_ \* and worn away because of all my en(e)mies.
- 8 Depart from me, all evil•do-ers, \* for the Lord has heard the sound of my weep-ing.
  - 9 The Lord has heard my suppliocation; \* the o Lord accepts (my) pray'r.
- 10 All my enemies shall be confounded and quake (with) fear; \* they shall turn back and sudden•ly be put (to) shame.



- 1 O Lord my God, I take refuge in you; \* save and deliver me from all who pur-sue me;
- 2 Lest like a lion they tear me in pie-ces \* and snatch me away with none to de-li(ver) me.
- 3 O Lord my God, if I have done these things: \* if there is any wick ed-ness in (my) hands,
- 4 If I have repaid my friend with e-vil, \* or plunder'd him who without cause is my e(ne)my;
- 5 Then let my enemy pursue and over take me, \* trample my life into the ground, and lay my ho-nor in (the) dust.
- 6 Stand up, O Lord, in your wrath; \* rise up against the fury of my e(ne)mies.
- 7 Awake, O my God, decree jus-tice; \* let the assembly of the peoples ga-ther round you.
- 8 Be seated on your lefty throne, O Most High; \* O Lord, judge the na-tions.
- 9 Give judgment for me according to my righteousness, O Lord, \* and according to my inno•cence, O Most High.
- 10 Let the malice of the wicked come to an end, / but establish the right-eous; \* for you test the mind and heart, O right(eous) God.
  - 11 God is my shield and de-fense; \* he is the savior of the true (in) heart.
  - 12 God is a righ teous judge; \* God sits in judg-ment ev'(ry) day.
- 13 If they will not repent, God will whet his sword; \* he will bend his bow and make it rea-dy.
- 14 He has prepar'd his weapons of death; \* he makes his ar-rows shafts (of) fire.
- 15 Look at those who are in labor with wick ed-ness, \* who conceive evil, and give birth to (a) lie.
- 16 They dig a pit and make it deep \* and fall into the hole that they (have) made.
- 17 Their malice turns back upon their own head; \* their violence falls on their (own) scalp.
- 18 I will bear witness that the Lord is right-eous; \* I will praise the Name of the Lord (Most) High.




- 1 O Lord our Go(ver)nor, \* how exalted is your Name in all (the) world!
- 2 Out of the mouths of infants and chil-dren \* your majesty is prais'd a bove the hea-vens.
- 3 You have set up a stronghold against your adver sar-ies, \* to quell the enemy and (the) a-ven-ger.
- 4 When I consider your heavens, / the work of your fin-gers, \* the moon and the stars you have set (in) their cour-ses,
- 5 What is man that you should be mindful of him? \_\_\_\_ \* the son of man that you should seek (him) out?
- 6 You have made him but little lower than the an-gels; \* you adorn him with glo(ry) and ho-nor;
- 7 You give him mastery over the works of your hands; \_\_\_\_ \* you put all things un-der his feet:
  - 8 All sheep and ox-en, \* even the wild beasts of the field,
- 9 The birds of the air, the fish of the sea, \_\_\_ \* and whatsoever walks in the paths of the sea.
- 10 O Lord our Go(ver)nor, \* how exalted is your Name in all (the) world! Glory to the Father, and to the Son, / and to the Holy Spi-rit: \* as it was in the beginning, is now, / and will be for ev-er. A-men.

#### **MORNING PRAYER**




- 1 I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with my whole heart; \* I will tell of all your mar-vel-ous works.
- 2 I will be glad and re-joice (in) you; \* I will sing to your Name, O Most High.
- 3 When my enemies are driv(en) back, \* they will stumble and perish at your pre-sence.
- 4 For you have maintain'd my right and my cause; \* you sit upon your throne judg(ing) right.
- 5 You have rebuk'd the ungodly and destroy'd the wick-ed; \* you have blotted out their name for ev•er and ev-er.
- 6 As for the enemy, they are finish'd, in perpe•tu'l ru-in, \* their cities plough'd under, / the memory of them per-ish'd;



- 7 But the Lord is enthron'd for ev-er; \* he has set up his throne for judg-ment.
- 8 It is he who rules the world with right(eous)ness; \* he judges the peo ples with e(qui)ty.
- 9 The Lord will be a refuge for the op-press'd,\_\_\_\_\* a refuge in time of trou-ble.
- 10 Those who know your Name will put their trust (in) you, \* for you never forsake those who seek you, (O) Lord.
- 11 Sing praise to the Lord who dwells in Zi-on; \* proclaim to the peoples the things he (has) done.
- 12 The Avenger of blood will re-mem(ber) them; \* he will not forget the cry of the af-flic-ted.
- 13 Have pity on me, (O) Lord, \* see the misery I suffer from those who hate me, / O you who lift me up from the gate (of) death;
- 14 So that I may tell of all your praises / and rejoice in your sal-va-tion \* in the gates of the ci•ty of Zi-on.
- 15 The ungodly have fallen into the pit they dug,\_\_\_\_ \* and in the snare they set is their own foot caught.
- 16 The Lord is known by his acts of jus-tice; \* the wicked are trapp'd in the works of their own hands.
- 17 The wicked shall be given over to (the) grave, \* and also all the peoples that for-get God.
- 18 For the needy shall not always be for-got-ten, \* and the hope of the poor shall not per•ish for ev-er.
- 19 Rise up, O Lord, / let not the ungodly have the up(per) hand; \* let them be judg'd be-fore you.
- 20 Put fear up•on them, (O) Lord; \* let the ungodly know they are but mor-tal.



- 1 Why do you stand so far off, (O) Lord, \* and hide yourself in time of trou-ble?
- 2 The wicked arrogantly persecute the poor,\_\_\_\* but they are trapp'd in the schemes they have (de)vis'd.



- 3 The wicked boast of their heart's de•sire;\_\_\_\* the covetous curse and re-vile (the) Lord.
- 4 The wicked are so proud that they care not (for) God; \* their only thought is, "God does not mat-ter."
- 5 Their ways are devious at all times; / your judgments are far above out of their sight; \_\_\_ \* they defy all their e(ne)mies.
- 6 They say in their heart, "I shall not be sha-ken; \* no harm shall happen to me ev-er."
- 7 Their mouth is full of cursing, deceit, and op pres-sion; \* under their tongue are mis-chief and wrong.
- 8 They lurk in ambush in public squares, / and in secret places they murder the in(no)cent; \* they spy out the help-less.
- 9 They lie in wait, like a lion in a covert; / they lie in wait to seize upon the low-ly; \* they seize the lowly and drag them a way in their net.
- 10 The innocent are broken and humbl'd be fore them; \* the helpless fall be-fore (their) pow'r.
- 11 They say in their heart, / "God has for ogot-ten; \* he hides his face; / he will one-ver no-tice."
- 12 Rise up, O Lord; / lift up your hand, (O) God; \* do not forget the af-flic-ted.
- 13 Why should the wicked revile God?\_\_\_\_\* why should they say in their heart, "You do not care"?
- 14 Surely, you behold trouble and mi(se)ry; \* you see it and take it in to your own hand.
- 15 The helpless commit them selves (to) you, \* for you are the hel per of or-phans.
- 16 Break the power of the wicked and e-vil; \* search out their wickedness un til you find none.
- 17 The Lord is King for ever and ev-er; \* the ungodly shall per-ish from (his) land.
- 18 The Lord will hear the desire of the hum-ble; \* you will strengthen their heart and your ears (shall) hear;
- 19 To give justice to the orphan and op press'd, \_\_\_ \* so that mere mortals maystrike ter-ror no more.




- 1 In the Lord have I taken re-fuge; \* how then can you say to me, / "Fly away like a bird (to) the hill-top;
- 2 For see how the wicked bend the bow and fit their arrows to the string, \* to shoot from ambush at the true (of) heart.
- 3 When the foundations are being de•stroy'd, \_\_\_ \* what can the right(eous) do?"
  - 4 The Lord is in his holy tem-ple; \* the Lord's throne (is) in hea-ven.
- 5 His eyes behold the inhabited world; \_\_\* his piercing eye weighs our worth.
- 6 The Lord weighs the righteous as well as the wick-ed, \* but those who delight in vi(o)lence he (ab)hors.
- 7 Upon the wicked he shall rain coals of fire and burning sul-phur; \* a scorching wind shall be (their) lot.
- 8 For the Lord is righteous; / he delights in right(eous) deeds; \* and the just shall see (his) face.

#### EVENING PRAYER




- 1 Help me, Lord, for there is no god ly one left; \* the faithful have vanish'd from a mong us.
- 2 Everyone speaks falsely with his neigh-bor; \* with a smooth tongue they speak from a doub•le heart.
- 3 Oh, that the Lord would cut off all smooth tongues,\_\_\_\_ \* and close the lips that utter proud boasts!
- 4 Those who say, "With our tongue will we (pre)vail; \* our lips are our own; / who is lord o ver us?"
- 5 "Because the needy are oppress'd, / and the poor cry out in mi(se)ry, \* I will rise up," says the Lord, / "and give them the help they long for."
- 6 The words of the Lord are pure words, \* like silver refin'd from ore / and purifi'd seven times in the fire.
  - 7 O Lord, watch o(ver) us \* and save us from this generation for ev-er.



8 The wicked • prowl on ev'(ry) side, \* and that which is worthless is highly priz'd by ev'•ry-one.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, / and to the • Ho-ly Spi-rit: \* as it was in the beginning, is now, / and will be for ever. • A-men.



- 1 How long, O Lord? / will you for get (me) for ev-er? \* how long will you hide your face (from) me?
- 2 How long shall I have perplexity in my mind, / and grief in my heart, day af-ter day? \* how long shall my enemy tri•umph ov(er) me?
- 3 Look upon me and answer me, (O) Lord my God; \* give light to my eyes, lest I sleep (in) death;
- 4 Lest my enemy say, "I have pre vail'd o-ver him," \* and my foes rejoice that I have fal-len.
- 5 But I put my trust (in) your mer-cy; \* my heart is joyful because of your sav(ing) help.
- 6 I will sing to the Lord, for he has dealt (with) me rich-ly; \* I will praise the Name of the Lord (Most) High.



- 1 The fool has said in his heart, "There is no God." \* All are corrupt and commit abominable acts; / there is none (who) does an(y) good.
- 2 The Lord looks down from hea(ven) up-on (us) all, \* to see if there is any who is wise, / if there is one who seeks af-ter God.
- 3 Every one has prov'd faithless; / all a•like have turn'd bad; \* there is none who does good; no, not one.
- 4 Have they no knowledge, all those e-vil-do-ers \* who eat up my people like bread / and do not call up-on (the) Lord?
- 5 See how they trem-ble with fear, \* because God is in the company of the right-eous.
- 6 Their aim is to confound the plans of the a-fflic-ted, \* but the Lord (is) their re-fuge.



7 O, that Israel's deliverance would come • out of Zi-on! \* when the Lord restores the fortunes of his people, / Jacob will rejoice and • Is-ra-el (be) glad.



#### MORNING PRAYER




- 1 Lord, who may dwell in your ta-ber-na-cle? \* who may abide upon your ho(ly) hill?

- 3 There is no guile upon his tongue; / he does no e(vil) to his friend; \* he does not heap contempt upon his neigh-bor.
- 4 In his sight the wicked is re-jec-ted, \* but he honors those who fear (the) Lord.
  - 5 He has sworn (to) do no wrong \* and does not take back (his) word.
- 6 He does not give his mon(ey) in (hope) of gain, \* nor does he take a bribe against the in(no)cent.
  - 7 Who ev(er) does these things \* shall never be ov(er)thrown.



- 1 Protect me, O God, for I take refuge in you; \_\_ \* I have said to the Lord, / "You are my Lord, my good a bove all oth-er."
- 2 All my delight is upon the godly that are in the land,\_\_\_\* upon those who are noble a mong the peo-ple.
- 3 But those who run after oth(er) gods \* shall have their trou-bles mul(ti)pli'd.
- 4 Their libations of blood I will not of-fer, \* nor take the names of their gods up-on (my) lips.
- 5 O Lord, you are my portion and my cup; \* it is you who up-hold (my) lot.



- 6 My boundaries enclose a plea(sant) land; \* indeed, I have a good-ly her(i)tage.
- 7 I will bless the Lord who gives me coun-sel; \* my heart teaches me, night af-ter night.
- 8 I have set the Lord always be fore me; \* because he is at my right hand I shall (not) fall.
- 9 My heart, therefore, is glad, and my spirit re•joi-ces; \* my body al•so shall rest (in) hope.
- 10 For you will not abandon me to the grave, \_\_\* nor let your ho•ly one see (the) Pit.
- 11 You will show me the path (of) life; \* in your presence there is fullness of joy, / and in your right hand are plea sures for ev(er)more.




- 1 Hear my plea of innocence, O Lord; / give heed to my cry; \* listen to my prayer, which does not come from ly(ing) lips.
- 2 Let my vindication come forth (from) your pre-sence; \* let your eyes be fix'd on jus-tice.
- 3 Weigh my heart, / sum-mon me (by) night, \* melt me down; / you will find no im pur-i-ty (in) me.
- 4 I give no offense with my mouth as oth(ers) do; \* I have heeded the words of your lips.
- 5 My footsteps hold fast to the ways of your law; \* in your paths my feet (shall) not stum-ble.
- 6 I call upon you, O God, for you will ans(wer) me; \* incline your ear to me and hear (my) words.
- 7 Show me your marvelous lov-ing-kind-ness, \* O Savior of those who take refuge at your right hand / from those who rise up a-gainst them.
- 8 Keep me as the ap-ple of (your) eye; \* hide me under the sha-dow of (your) wings,
- 9 From the wicked who as-sault me, \* from my deadly enemies who sur-round me.
- 10 They have clos'd their heart to pi-ty, \* and their mouth speaks proud things.




- 11 They press me hard, / now (they) sur-round me, \* watching how they may cast me to (the) ground,
- 12 Like a lion, greed-y for (its) prey, \* and like a young lion lurking in sec-ret pla-ces.
- 13 Arise, O Lord; / confront them and bring (them) down; \* deliver me from the wick-ed by (your) sword.
- 14 Deliver me, O Lord, by your hand \* from those whose portion in life is this world;
- 15 Whose bellies you fill (with) your trea-sure, \* who are well suppli'd with children / and leave their wealth (to) their lit(tle) ones.
- 16 But at my vindication I shall see (your) face; \* when I awake, I shall be satisfi'd, / be hold(ing) your like-ness.

#### **EVENING PRAYER**




- 1 I love you, O Lord (my) strength, \* O Lord my stronghold, my crag, and my ha-ven.
- 2 My God, my rock in whom I put (my) trust, \* my shield, the horn of my salvation, and my refuge; / you are wor-thy of praise.
  - 3 I will call up-on (the) Lord, \* and so shall I be sav'd from my e(ne)mies.
- 4 The breakers of death roll'd ov(er) me, \* and the torrents of oblivion made me a-fraid.
- 5 The cords of hell en-tan(gl'd) me, \* and the snares of death were set (for) me.
- 6 I call'd upon the Lord in my (dis)tress \* and cri'd out to my God (for) help.
- 7 He heard my voice from his hea(ven)ly dwel-ling; \* my cry of anguish came to his ears.
- 8 The earth reel'd and rock'd; \* the roots of the mountains shook; / they reel'd because of his an-ger.
- 9 Smoke rose from his nostrils / and a consuming fire out of his mouth; \* hot burning coals blaz'd forth (from) him.



- 10 He parted the hea(vens) and came down \* with a storm cloud un-der his feet.
- 11 He mounted on cher-u-bim (and) flew; \* he swoop'd on the wings of the wind.
- 12 He wrapp'd dark(ness) a-bout him; \* he made dark waters and thick clouds his pa-vil-ion.
- 13 From the brightness of his pre-sence, through (the) clouds, \* burst hail•stones and coals (of) fire.
  - 14 The Lord thunder'd out of hea-ven; \* the Most High ut-ter'd his voice.
- 15 He loos'd his ar(rows) and scat(ter'd) them; \* he hurl'd thunder bolts and rou(ted) them.
- 16 The beds of the seas were uncover'd, / and the foundations of the world laid bare, \* at your battle cry, O Lord, / at the blast of the breath of your nos-trils.
- 17 He reach'd down from on high and grasp'd me; \* he drew me out of great wa-ters.
- 18 He deliver'd me from my strong enemies / and from those who hat(ed) me; \* for they were too might-y for me.
- 19 They confronted me in the day of my dis-as-ter; \* but the Lord was my (sup)port.
- 20 He brought me out in •to an o(pen) place; \* he rescu'd me because he de ligh-ted in me.



- 21 The Lord rewarded me because of my righteous deal-ing; \* because my hands were clean (he) re-ward(ed) me;
- 22 For I have kept the ways of the Lord \_\_\_ \* and have not of fen(ded) a-gainst (my) God;
- 23 For all his judgments are be fore (my) eyes, \* and his decrees I have not put a-way (from) me;
- 24 For I have been blameless with him \_\_\_ \* and have kept myself from in-i(qui)ty;
- 25 Therefore the Lord rewarded me according to my righteous deal-ing, \* because of the cleanness of my hands in his sight.




- 26 With the faithful you show yourself faithful, O God; \_\_\_ \* with the forthright you show (your)self forth-right.
- 27 With the pure you show yourself pure, \_\_\_ \* but with the crooked you are wi-ly.
- 28 You will save a lowly peo-ple, \* but you will hum(ble) the haugh(ty) eyes.
- 29 You, O Lord, are my lamp; \_\_\_ \* my God, you make my dark(ness) bright.
- 30 With you I will break down an en•clo-sure; \* with the help of my God I (will) scale an(y) wall.
- 31 As for God, his ways are perfect; / the words of the Lord are tri'd in the fire; \_\_\_\_ \* he is a shield to all who trust (in) him.
- 32 For who is God, but the Lord? \_\_\_ \* who is the Rock, ex-cept (our) God?
- 33 It is God who girds me about with strength \_\_\_ \* and makes my way (se)cure.
- 34 He makes me sure-footed like a deer \_\_\_\_ \* and lets me stand firm on the heights.
- 35 He trains my hands for bat-tle \* and my arms for bending ev(en) a bow (of) bronze.
- 36 You have given me your shield of vic(to)ry; \* your right hand also sustains me; / your lov(ing) care makes (me) great.
- 37 You lengthen my stride be neath me, and my an(kles) do not (give) way.
- 38 I pursue my enemies and over take them; \* I will not turn back till I (have) de-stroy'd them.

- 44 A people I have not known shall serve me; / no sooner shall they hear than they shall o bey me; \* strangers will cringe be-fore me.




- 45 The foreign peoples will lose heart; \_\_\_ \* they shall come trembling out (of) their strong-holds.



- 14 Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart / be acceptable in your sight,\_\_\* O Lord, my strength and my re-dee-mer.




- 1 May the Lord answer you in the day of trou-ble, \* the Name of the God of Ja•cob de-fend you;






- 1 The Lord is my light and my salvation; / whom then shall (I) fear? \* the Lord is the strength of my life; / of whom then shall I be (a)fraid?

- 11 Save your people and bless your in-her(i)tance; \* shepherd them and carry them for ev-er.




- 1 Ascribe to the Lord, you gods, \_\_\_ \* ascribe to the Lord glo-ry and strength.




- 1 Happy are they whose transgressions are for giv-en, \* and whose sin is put (a)way!

- 9 "I will instruct you and teach you in the way that you should go; \* I will guide you with (my) eye.




- 10 Do not be like horse or mule, which have no under stand-ing; \* who must be fitted with bit and bridle, or else they will not stay near you."

- 22 Let your loving-kindness, O Lord, (be) up-on us, \* as we have put our trust (in) you.





- 18 For the power of the wicked shall be bro-ken, \* but the Lord up holds the right-eous.






- 19 The Lord cares for the lives of the god-ly, \* and their inheritance shall last for ev-er.

- 35 The Lord will not abandon them to their hand,\_\_\_ \* nor let them be found guil(ty) when brought (to) trial.





- 20 Like a dream when one a wa-kens, O Lord, \* when you arise you will make their im-age van-ish.




- 21 When my mind be came em-bit-ter'd, \* I was sorely wound-ed in (my) heart.




- 1 We give you thanks, O God, we give you thanks, \* calling upon your Name and declaring all your won(der)ful deeds.

- 4 How glorious you are! \_\_\_ \* more splendid than the ever•last-ing moun-tains!
- 5 The strong of heart have been despoil'd; / they sink into sleep;\_\_\_\* none of the warr•iors can lift (a) hand.
  - 6 At your rebuke, O God of Ja-cob, \* both horse and ri-der lie stunn'd.
- 7 What terror you in spire! \_\_\_ \* who can stand before you when you are an-gry?
- 8 From heaven you pronounc'd judg-ment; \* the earth was a fraid and (was) still;
- 9 When God rose up to judg-ment \* and to save all the op•press'd of the earth.
- 10 Truly, wrathful Edom will give (you) thanks, \* and the remnant of Ha•math will keep (your) feasts.

- 9 Has God forgotten to be gra-cious? \* has he, in his anger, withheld his com-pas-sion?
- 10 And I said, "My grief (is) this: \* the right hand of the Most High has lost its po-wer."
- 11 I will remember the works of the Lord, \_\_\_ \* and call to mind your wonders of old time.
  - 12 I will meditate on all (your) acts \* and ponder your migh(ty) deeds.
  - 13 Your way, O God, is ho-ly; \* who is so great a god as our God?
- 14 You are the God who works won-ders \* and have declar'd your power among the peo-ples.
- 15 By your strength you have redeem'd your peo-ple, \* the children of Jacob and Jo-seph.

- 18 The sound of your thunder was in the whirlwind; / your lightnings lit up the world; \_\_\_ \* the earth trem•bl'd and shook.




- 19 Your way was in the sea, and your paths in the great wa-ters, \* yet your foot steps were (not) seen.


#### **EVENING PRAYER**



- 1 Hear my teaching, O my peo-ple; \* incline your ears to the words of my mouth.
- 2 I will open my mouth (in) a pa(ra)ble; \* I will declare the myste ries of an(cient) times.
- 3 That which we have heard and known, and what our fore fa(thers) have told us, \* we will not hide from their chil-dren.
- 4 We will recount to generations to come the praiseworthy deeds and the po-wer of (the) Lord, \* and the wonderful works he has done.
- 5 He gave his decrees to Jacob and establish'd a law for Is(ra)el, \* which he commanded them to teach their chil-dren;
- 6 That the generations to come might know, / and the chil-dren yet (un)born; \* that they in their turn might tell it to their chil-dren;
- 7 So that they might put their trust (in) God, \* and not forget the deeds of God, but keep his com-mand-ments;
- 8 And not be like their forefathers, a stubborn and rebellious ge-ne-ra-tion, \* a generation whose heart was not steadfast / and whose spirit was not faith-ful to God.
- 9 The people of Ephraim, arm'd with the bow, \* turn'd back in the day of bat-tle;
- 10 They did not keep the co-ve-nant (of) God, \* and refus'd to walk in his law:
  - 11 They for got what he (had) done, \* and the wonders he had shown them.
- 12 He work'd marvels in the sight of their fore-fa-thers, \* in the land of Egypt, in the field of Zo-an.
- 13 He split open the sea and let them pass through; \* he made the wa•ters stand up (like) walls.



- 14 He led them with a cloud (by) day, \* and all the night through with a glow (of) fire.
- 15 He split the hard rocks (in) the wil(der)ness \* and gave them drink as from the great deep.
- 16 He brought streams out of the cliff, \* and the waters gush'd out like ri-vers.
- 17 But they went on sinn(ing) a-gainst him, \* rebelling in the desert a gainst the Most High.
  - 18 They tested God in their hearts, \* demanding food for their cra-ving.
- 19 They rail'd (a)gainst God (and) said, \* "Can God set a table in the wil(der)ness?
- 20 True, he struck the rock, / the waters gush'd out, and the gul-lies ov(er)flow'd; \* but is he able to give bread or to provide meat for his peo-ple?"
- 21 When the Lord heard this, he was full (of) wrath; \* a fire was kindl'd against Jacob, and his anger mounted a-gainst Is(ra)el;
- 22 For they had no faith (in) God, \* nor did they put their trust in his sa-ving po-wer.
- 23 So he com•mand(ed) the clouds (a)bove \* and open'd the doors of heav-en.
- 24 He rain'd down manna up on them to eat \* and gave them of grain from heav-en.
- 25 So mortals ate the bread of an-gels; \* he provided for them food (e)nough.
- 26 He caus'd the east wind to blow (in) the heav-ens \* and led out the south wind by (his) might.
- 27 He rain'd down flesh up•on them like dust \* and wingèd birds like the sand of the sea.
- 28 He let it fall in the midst of their camp \* and round a bout their dwell-ings.
  - 29 So they ate (and) were well fill'd, \* for he gave them what (they) crav'd.
- 30 But they did not stop their crav-ing, \* though the food was still in their mouths.
- 31 So God's anger mount(ed) a-gainst them; \* he slew their strongest men and laid low the youth of Is(ra)el.
- 32 In spite of all this, they went on sin-ning \* and had no faith in his won-der-ful works.
- 33 So he brought their days to an end like a breath \* and their years in sud-den ter-ror.



- 34 Whenever he slew them, they would seek him, \* and repent, and dili•gent-ly search (for) God.
- 35 They would remember that God was their rock, \* and the Most High God their re-deem-er.
- 36 But they flat(ter'd) him with (their) mouths \* and lied to him with (their) tongues.
- 37 Their heart was not stead-fast t'ward him, \* and they were not faithful to his co(ve)nant.
- 38 But he was so merciful that he forgave their sins / and did not des-troy them; \* many times he held back his anger and did not permit his wrath to be rous'd.
- 39 For he remember'd that they were but flesh, \* a breath that goes forth and does not (re)turn.



- 40 How often the people disobey'd him in the wil(der)ness \* and offended him in the de-sert!
- 41 Again and again they temp(ted) God \* and provok'd the Holy One of Is(ra)el.
- 42 They did not remember his po-wer \* in the day when he ransom'd them from the e(ne)my;
- 43 How he wrought his signs in E-gypt \* and his omens in the field of Zo-an.
- 44 He turn'd their rivers into blood, \_\_ \* so that they could not drink of their streams.
- 45 He sent swarms of flies among them, which ate them up, \_\_\_ \* and frogs, (which) de-stroy'd them.
- 46 He gave their crops to the cater pil-lar, \* the fruit of their toil (to) the lo-cust.
  - 47 He kill'd their vines (with) hail \* and their sy-ca-mores (with) frost.
- 48 He deliver'd their cattle to hail-stones \* and their livestock to hot thun(der)bolts.
- 49 He pour'd out upon them his blazing an-ger: \* fury, indignation, and distress, / a troop of de stroy-ing an-gels.

- 50 He gave full rein to his anger; / he did not spare their souls (from) death; \* but deliver'd their lives to the plague.
- 51 He struck down all the firstborn of E-gypt, \* the flower of manhood in the dwel-lings of Ham.
- 52 He led out his people like sheep \_\_\_ \* and guided them in the wil(der)ness like (a) flock.
- 53 He led them to safety, and they were not (a)fraid; \* but the sea over•whelm'd their e(ne)mies.
- 54 He brought them to his ho(ly) land, \* the mountain his right hand (had) won.
- 55 He drove out the Canaanites before them / and apportion'd an inheritance to them by lot; \_\_\_ \* he made the tribes of Israel to dwell in their tents.
- 56 But they tested the Most High God, and de•fi'd him, \* and did not keep (his) com-mand-ments.
- 57 They turn'd away and were disloyal like their fa-thers; \* they were undependable like a warp'd bow.
- 58 They griev'd him with their hill al-tars \* and provok'd his displeasure with their i-dols.
  - 59 When God heard this, he was an-gry \* and utterly re•jec-ted Is(ra)el.
- 60 He forsook the shrine at Shi-loh, \* the tabernacle where he had liv'd a mong his peo-ple.
- 61 He deliver'd the ark into cap ti(vi)ty, \* his glory into the ad-ver-sa(ry's) hand.
- 62 He gave his people to the sword \_\_\_ \* and was anger'd a gainst (his) in-he(ri)tance.
- 63 The fire consum'd their young men; \_\_\_ \* there were no wedding songs (for) their maid-ens,
- 64 Their priests fell by the sword, \_\_\_ \* and their widows made no la-men-ta-tion.
- 65 Then the Lord woke as though (from) sleep, \* like a war(rior) re-fresh'd (with) wine.
- 66 He struck his enemies on the back-side \* and put them to per-pe(tu'l) shame.
- 67 He rejected the tent of Jo-seph \* and did not choose the tribe of Eph(ra)im;
- 68 He chose instead the tribe of Ju-dah \* and Mount Zi-on, which (he) lov'd.



- 69 He built his sanctuary like the heights of heav-en, \* like the earth which he foun(ded) for ev-er.
- 70 He chose David his ser-vant, \* and took him a way (from) the sheep-folds.
- 71 He brought him from following the ewes, \_\_\_ \* to be a shepherd over Jacob his people / and over Israel his in-he(ri)tance.
- 72 So he shepherded them with a faithful and true heart \_\_\_\* and guided them with the skill(ful)ness of (his) hands.





- 10 Why should the heathen say, "Where is their God?" \* Let it be known among the heathen and in our sight / that you avenge the shedding of your ser-vants' blood.




- 11 Let the sorrowful sighing of the prisoners come be-fore you, \* and by your great might spare those who are con•demn'd to die.

- 13 For we are your people and the sheep (of) your pas-ture; \* we will give you thanks for ever and show forth your praise from age (to) age.





- 14 Turn now, O God of hosts, look down from heaven; / be•hold and tend (this) vine; \* preserve what your right hand has plan-ted.
- 15 They burn it with fire like rub-bish; \* at the rebuke of your countenance let them per-ish.
- 16 Let your hand be upon the man of your (right) hand, \* the son of man you have made so **strong** for your-self.

- 18 Restore us, O Lord God of hosts;\_\_\_\* show the light of your countenance, and we shall be sav'd.




- 1 Sing with joy (to) God our strength \* and raise a loud shout to the God of Ja-cob.

- 9 Do to them as you did to Mi(di)an, \* to Sisera, and to Jabin at the ri(ver) of Ki-shon:
- 10 They were des•troy'd at En-dor; \* they became like dung up-on (the) ground.
- 11 Make their leaders like O(reb) and Ze-ëb, \* and all their commanders like Ze(bah) and Zal(mun)na,
- 12 Who said, "Let us take for our-selves \* the fields of God as our pos-ses-sion."
- 13 O my God, make (them) like whir(ling) dust \* and like chaff be-fore (the) wind;
- 14 Like fire that burns (down) a for-est, \* like the flame that sets moun-tains a-blaze.
- 15 Drive them with your tem-pest \* and terri•fy them with (your) storm;

- 17 May the graciousness of the Lord our God be up•on us; \* prosper the work of our hands; / pros•per our han(di)work.





- 10 He has not dealt with us according to our sins,\_\_\_ \* nor rewarded us according to our wick(ed)ness.
- 11 For as the heavens are high above the earth,\_\_\_ \* so is his mercy great upon those who fear him.
- 12 As far as the east is from the west, \_\_\_ \* so far has he re•mov'd our sins (from) us.
- 13 As a father cares for his chil-dren, \* so does the Lord care for those who fear him.



- 14 For he himself knows whereof we are made; \* he remembers that we are but dust.
- 15 Our days are like the grass; \_\_\_ \* we flourish like a flo-wer of (the) field:
- 16 When the wind goes over it, it is gone, \_\_\_ \* and its place shall know it no more.
- 17 But the merciful goodness of the Lord endures for ever on those who fear him, \* and his righteousness on chil-dren's chil-dren;
- 18 On those who keep his co(ve)nant \* and remember his com•mand(ments) to do them.





- 21 He set him as a master ov(er) his house-hold, \* as a ruler over all his pos-ses-sions,
- 22 To instruct his princes ac cord-ing to (his) will \* and to teach his el-ders wis-dom.



- 23 Israel came into E-gypt, \* and Jacob became a sojourner in the land (of) Ham.
- 24 The Lord made his people exceedingly fruit-ful; \* he made them stronger than their e(ne)mies;



- 25 Whose heart he turn'd, so that they hated his peo-ple, \* and dealt unjustly with his ser-vants.

  - 34 He spoke, and the lo(cust) came, \* and young locusts with-out num-ber,
- 35 Which ate up all the green plants in their land \_\_\_ \* and devour'd the fruit of their soil.
- 36 He struck down the firstborn of their land, \_\_\_ \* the first•fruits of all (their) strength.
- 37 He led out his people with silver and gold; \_\_\_ \* in all their tribes there was not one that stum-bl'd.
  - 38 Egypt was glad of their go-ing, \* because they were a-fraid (of) them.
- 39 He spread out a cloud for a cov'-ring \* and a fire to give light in (the) night sea-son.

- 44 He gave his people the lands of the na-tions, \* and they took the fruit of oth(ers') toil,



- 31 This was reckon'd to him as righ(teous)ness \* throughout all gene•ra(tions) for ev-er.
- 32 Again they provok'd his anger at the waters of Me(ri)bah, \* so that he punish'd Mo(ses) be-cause (of) them;
- 33 For they so embitter'd his spi-rit \* that he spoke rash words with (his) lips.
- 34 They did not destroy the peo-ples \* as the Lord (had) com-man(ded) them.
  - 35 They intermingl'd with the hea-then \* and learn'd their pa(gan) ways,
  - 36 So that they worship'd their i-dols, \* which be came a snare (to) them.
  - 37 They sacrific'd their sons \_\_\_\_ \* and their daughters to ev-il spir-its.
- 38 They shed innocent blood, the blood of their sons and daugh-ters, \* which they offer'd to the idols of Canaan, / and the land (was) de-fil'd (with) blood.
- 39 Thus they were polluted by their ac-tions \* and went whoring in their ev(il) deeds.



- 40 Therefore the wrath of the Lord was kindl'd against his peo-ple \* and he ab•horr'd (his) in-he(ri)tance.
- 41 He gave them over to the hand of the hea-then, \* and those who hated them rul'd ov(er) them.
- 42 Their enemies op press'd them, \* and they were humbl'd un-der their hand.
- 43 Many a time did he deliver them, / but they rebell'd through their own de •vi-ces, \* and were brought down in their in-i(qui)ty.
- 44 Nevertheless, he saw their dis•tress, \_\_\_ \* when he heard their la-men-ta-tion.
- 45 He remember'd his covenant with them \_\_\_ \* and relented in accordance with his great mer-cy.
  - 46 He caus'd them to be pi-ti'd \* by those who held them cap-tive.
- 47 Save us, O Lord our God, and gather us from among the na-tions, \* that we may give thanks to your holy Name and glo-ry in (your) praise.







- 32 Let them exalt him in the congregation of the peo-ple \* and praise him in the council of the el-ders.



- 33 The Lord chang'd rivers into de-serts, \* and water-springs in-to thirs(ty) ground,
- 34 A fruitful land into salt flats, \* because of the wickedness of those who dwell there.
- 35 He chang'd deserts into pools of wa-ter \* and dry land in-to wa(ter)-springs.
  - 36 He settl'd the hun gry there, \* and they founded a ci ty to dwell in.
- 37 They sow'd fields, and planted vine-yards, \* and brought in a fruit-ful har-vest.
- 38 He bless'd them, so that they increas'd great-ly; \* he did not let their herds (de)crease.
- 39 Yet when they were diminish'd and brought low, \* through stress of adversi•ty and sor-row,
- 40 [He pours contempt on prin-ces \* and makes them wan der in track(less) wastes.]

- 43 Whoever is wise will ponder these things, \* and consider well the mer-cies of (the) Lord.


